Introduction

Welcome to orchestra! I am so excited for this year! Orchestra offers abundant opportunities for fun, but also growth as an individual! I look forward to helping your student advance as not only a musician, but also as an amazing leader. Orchestra requires commitment, responsibility, and perseverance. This handbook will provide you with helpful guidelines in making the most of your time in the orchestra. I greatly look forward to all of the fun we'll have this year growing together as an ensemble!

Mission Statement

The mission of North Hancock Elementary School orchestra program is to grow students not only as musicians, but also as leaders and individuals. Through participation in this ensemble students will learn valuable life skills including teamwork, responsibility, and self discipline.

Tentative Schedule

Rehearsal: Orchestra will meet from 3:30-4:30 PM two days each school week. Students will be called down to the cafeteria for a snack and then lead to the music room around 3:30. We will rehearse every Monday and Thursday from 3:30-4:30 PM, students may be picked up in the car rider area. After school rehearsals will begin September 30, 2019.

An additional calendar with the remainder of the 2019 rehearsals and performances will be sent out the last week of October.

Performances: We will have at least two performances this year. There will be one performance in the winter and one performance in the spring. Officials dates are TBA, announcement of dates will be sent home with students and posted on my teacher website.

Application and Fee

All students must turn in all fees and forms fully completed before they can participate in orchestra. Forms required to be turned in and completed include the following: a signed handbook agreement with signatures from student and parent or guardian and a completed application. Please keep this handbook for your own personal records and turn in the last page only to the music room. Along with this form there is also a nonrefundable \$40 fee. This small fee assists in covering the cost of music, supplies, and minor instrument repairs. Students and their parent or guardian are responsible for paying for large repairs to broken instruments and replacing any lost supplies. If you have a concern about the financial commitment, please email me. I do not want money to be the reason a student cannot participate.

If you would like, you may purchase your own, new supplies for \$35 from Royal Music in Bowling Green. The String Kit offered by Royal Music includes an Essential Elements 2000 for Strings Book 1, black folding music stand, rosin, polishing cloth, sponge shoulder rest for violins and rock stops for cellos.

The school has a limited number of instruments, especially cellos. Instruments will be given out on a first come, first serve basis to students who have completed and turned in all required paperwork in addition to the \$40 fee. If we run out of instruments, you may rent an instrument through Royal Music. I have Royal Music Co. Rental Applications available upon request. I can turn in your paperwork to them, but all payments must be made directly to them. Also, cellos are not allowed on school buses. They must be dropped off by a parent in the morning. Violins are allowed on the bus.

Fundraisers

Fundraisers will be held throughout the year to benefit the students in this ensemble. All students are required to participate in orchestra fundraisers. Proceeds from all fundraisers will go towards ensemble field trips, major instrument repairs, and future instrument or music purchases.

Student Responsibilities

Students are responsible for being ready for rehearsal on time and with all materials. In order to be fully prepared students need their instrument, bow, case, pencil (no pens!), an eraser, folder with sheet music, book and other instrument supplies.

Orchestra is fun, but also a commitment. <u>Students must participate and attend all concerts and fundraisers.</u> It is okay to miss rehearsal for illness or family emergency. Students are, however, responsible for bringing a note from parent (or email) within 2 days of the missed rehearsal. If more than three rehearsals are missed without a parent note, the student will be notified and removed from orchestra

Instrument Care

In order to ensure the quality of our instruments, the rules below must be followed.

- I will keep my instruments in its case when not in use and will treat the case as part of the instrument. I will NOT sit on the case.
- I will not eat or drink anything except water while I am playing on the school owned instrument.
- I will maintain my instrument and immediately notify Ms. McMichael of damages made to the instrument.
- I will NOT try to repair the instrument on my own or with my parent(s)/guardian(s).
- I and my parent/guardian will pay for any major instrument repairs or lost supplies.
- I understand that I will return the instrument as clean as I received it or I will be charged to have it professionally cleaned by Royal Music.
- In the unfortunate event that the instrument is lost or stolen, I will reimburse North Hancock Elementary School Orchestra for the cost of a comparable replacement at the time the loss occurs.
- I will be the only one to play this instrument. I will not let siblings or friends play with my instrument.
- I will follow the care instructions given by Ms. McMichael to keep my instrument clean and in the best shape possible.
- I will keep my instrument away from doors, windows, heaters, or any location susceptible to extreme temperatures.

Communication

All information about performances, rehearsal, fundraisers, schedule changes, and other important information for the entire orchestra will be sent home in writing, email, or on my teacher website. Please feel free to contact me directly with any questions or concerns. I am available everyday at school between 8-9 AM or after 3:15 PM. I will do my best to keep the Orchestra page on my teacher website updated with information and event announcements.
